



U.S. Leadership in Sustainable Cotton Production



USDA is investing up to 2.8 billion in 70 selected projects for Climate-Smart Commodities.

\$90 million of funding will be allocated to the U.S. Climate Smart Cotton Program. U.S. Cotton Trust Protocol & Climate Smart Cotton program establish the U.S. industry as a leader in mitigating the impact of climate change.
